James Garfield made a speech at Arlington National Cemetery, after which around 5,000 participants helped to decorate the graves of the more than 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers

Fresh apricots give ice cream a healthy kick

For Californians, fresh apricots began shipping in early May & their season is expected to peak May 25-30 & again June 15-July 4.

- 1 can (12 ounces) skimmed, evaporated milk
- 1 envelope plain gelatin
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 1/2 cups diced, ripe, fresh apricots (about 3/4 pound)
- 1 can (12 ounces) apricot nectar
- 2 cups plain low-fat yogurt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 7 pounds small ice cubes
- 1 cup rock salt or table salt,

According to ice cream-maker directions

Combine milk & gelatin in large saucepan. Heat, stirring often, until gelatin dissolves. Add sugar & heat until it dissolves. Using a wire whip, stir in apricots, apricot nectar, yogurt & vanilla. Pour mixture into canister of ice cream maker & assemble the machine. Make alternate layers of ice & salt around the canister. Churn 20-30 minutes or

until softly frozen; pack into containers & freeze. For the best flavor, let ice cream soften slightly before serving. Makes about 2 quarts.



THE GIANT SEQUOIAS & REDWOODS


Giant sequoias and California redwoods (also called coast redwoods) are nature's skyscrapers. These enormous trees exist primarily in Northern California, and though they have a number of common characteristics including distinctive cinnamon-red bark, they are different species. One giant sequoia

(Sequoiadendron giganteum), known as General Sherman, is the world's largest tree, while a redwood (Sequoia sempervirens) called Hyperion is the tallest.

Giant sequoias can grow to be about 30 feet (9 meters) in diameter and more than 250 feet (76 meters) tall. The biggest of these behemoths is General Sherman, a giant sequoia in Sequoia National Park. General Sherman stands 275 feet (84 meters) tall, has a 102-foot (31 meters) circumference, and weighs an incredible 2.7 million pounds (1.2 million kilograms).

Giant sequoias can live to 3,000 years, with the oldest on living more than 3,500 years. Mature sequoias lack branches on the lower half of their trunks. Sequoia trunks taper as they rise, forming a rounded top where individual branches sweep downward. Their green leaves are small, scale-like, and arranged in spirals. Both male and female cones are carried on the same tree.


