Did you know?

Tree Mortality

Governor Brown issued an Executive Order addressing tree mortality in October 2015, establishing the Tree Mortality Task Force (TMTF). It is made up of more than 80 State and federal agencies, local governments, utilities, and other stakeholders working together to address tree mortality.



Ten counties starting in Placer County and extending along the Central Sierra into Kern County have been identified as high hazard zones for tree mortality. Each county has a disaster declaration and a task force to help address the risks from tree mortality. As of 2016, the TMTF estimated the number of dead trees in "high priority counties", including Tulare, at 76 million trees. In Tulare County, it is estimated there are over 1.7 Million dead trees in "high risk" Tier 1 areas. Over half a million of those were on private, state and local land.

Forest Safety

Be aware of your surroundings as trees can fall without warning. Avoid dense patches of dead trees when it's windy or following a snowstorm when branches are covered with snow.

Trees without needles, with red or brown needles, with reddish-brown pitch tubes (½-¾ inch blobs of sap on the outside of a tree trunk), flaking bark, or holes in the bark caused by woodpeckers may be infested with bark beetles or other insects and may fall at any time.



Fire Safety

Dead trees with red needles are more flammable than live trees. Once the needles are gone, the standing dead trees generally do not pose an increased risk of wildfire. When the trees eventually fall to the ground, the potential of increased fire severity returns with the increased amount of fuel on the forest floor.

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN MEMORIAL DAY AND VETERANS DAY

Many people confuse Memorial Day and Veterans Day. Memorial Day is a day for remembering and honoring military personnel who died in the service of their country, particularly those who died in battle or as a result of wounds sustained in battle.

While those who died are also remembered, Veterans Day is the day set aside to thank and honor ALL who served—in wartime or peacetime—and whether they died or survived. Veterans Day is always observed officially on November 11, regardless of the day of the week on which it falls.
